Syllabus Recognizing Issues That Affect Performance Horses

Introduction:

This is an intermediate level course that will guide the student beyond a basic understanding of anatomy and movement, to learn more about issues that may affect the ability of the performance horse to be comfortable in its job. Our course <u>Equine Anatomy and Health</u> <u>Considerations</u> introduced the student to the structure, physiology, health parameters and some of the diseases that may be encountered in the performance horse. The next course, <u>Basic Biomechanics – Understanding Horse Movement</u> then introduced the student to how horses move in nature, the gaits, and how they can be developed when ridden to work with their structure and balance.

This course will add to that prior body of knowledge with:

- 1. Numerous short videos to help the student visualize lameness originating in different parts of the body.
- 2. Anatomy and biomechanics review
- 3. Detailed information and videos on hoof and dental issues
- 4. In depth information and videos on saddle fit and its effect on the comfort and structural health of the horse

Course Duration:

This is a self-paced independent study course. It must be started within 3 months of sign-up and completed within 12 months. There will be no tuition refunds. If a student desires to drop the course within the first 30 days, they may be eligible to receive a 50% refund upon written

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request. Extensions may be granted at the discretion of Avalon Performance Horse and Rider Support upon request by the student.

Assignments, Tests, and Grading:

- The course is divided into five sections. Each section has a quiz at the end.
- You do not need to have access to horses to take this course, but your experience will be enriched if you can observe them in action.
- Each quiz must be passed with a score of 70% or better in order to proceed to the next work assignment. By the end of the course, section quiz scores will be averaged to arrive at a final course grade of A (≥90%), B (≥80%), C (≥70%), or Incomplete (meaning not all sections were passed within 12 months) The course grade will be given as a percentage.
- A student with an incomplete may re-take the course by re-registering and paying for the course.

Estimated Time Commitment and Equivalence to Credit Hours

This course contains five sections with an estimated time commitment of 75 hours of study and exercises plus quizzes for a total time commitment of 90 hours, equivalent to 9.0 CEUs or 5 credit hours.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Upon completion of the course, the student will have been exposed to numerous lameness videos with commentary by a renowned performance horse veterinarian.
- 2. The student will have been exposed to a methodology that can help to identify the source and possible severity of lameness to aid in understanding when to call the vet.
- 3. The student will have gained familiarity with the most common issues affecting the hooves, teeth, and the possible impacts to performance when they are not properly managed.
- 4. The student will have been exposed to theories of saddle fit from two highly regarded professionals in the performance saddle industry.
